Beaverhill Bird Observatory Update August 16th to 31st, 2014

Fall migration is well underway!!! From the 16th to the 31st we managed to catch 294 birds! Migration has been busy and very exciting. Some of the highlights in this time period included American Redstart (27 captured!), Blue-headed Vireo, Magnolia Warbler, Mourning Warbler, Sharp-shinned Hawk, Black-throated Green Warbler, Blackpoll Warbler, Canada Warbler, Common Yellowthroat, and Orange-crowned Warbler. The BBO staff have been filled with suspense and adrenaline from one net check to the next.

Sightings on daily census have been few and far between thus far, but things are certain to pick up in September. The lakebed has yielded a few sparrow species here and there but the usual abundance of Red-tailed Hawks and Northern Harriers has not been observed. Therefore we have relied heavily on banding to survey passing birds and the new nets, in conjunction with the old, have



kept us busy. The new nets caught a total of 147 birds of 19 species in 357 total net hours. Comparatively the old nets caught a total of 147 birds as well but of 21 species in 733.5 total net hours. The results are summarized in tables 1 and 2 below.

The lab received quite a few infrastructure updates recently, mostly thanks to Al Degroot. Al removed our old fireplace and installed a much more user-friendly propane heater! Once things cool off in September the BBO staff will be very grateful for this upgrade. Al also installed 4 new LED light strips, 3 in the kitchen and one in the banding lab. We are now able to see birds much more clearly first thing in



the morning when processing them in the lab. Thanks Al!

Being the end of August, the BBO staff was sad to see their summer assistant head back to school. Jerry Gordy was an integral part of the team this summer, allowing us to complete more work than we could have ever imagined while having loads of fun as we went. Jerry is back at the University of Alberta for his senior year in Environmental and Conservation Sciences. We will miss you Jerry!
