## Weekly Update October 15th to 21st, 2016

What a great week out at the lab! The weather has been slowly improving and we were finally able to open songbird nets before our take-down date on the 20<sup>th</sup>. The few songbirds caught this week were Black-capped Chickadees, Slate-coloured Juncos, and American Tree Sparrows.

The Saw-whet numbers have also finally picked up and we are back on track to keep up with the record year in 2015; however, the numbers have been quite variable with some nights as low as 1 owl, but others as high as 32, so the banders have to be prepared for anything! We also begun monitoring Boreal Owls in addition to our Saw-whet owl nets, and it has started off quite strongly with three Boreals already caught in this first week. We catch Boreal Owls in a similar way to the Saw-whets – with mist nets and an audio playback of their territorial call.
