## Weekly Update September 10<sup>th</sup> to September 16<sup>th</sup>, 2016

The weeks are really flying by! It is hard to believe that we are already half way through September. It's easy to think the summer is already over, but the occasional mosquito tells us not to get too far ahead of ourselves as well still haven't had any serious frosts. Our migrant feeder birds, such as American Goldfinches, Rose-breasted Grosbreaks, and Ruby-throated Hummingbirds have either completely left in the past few weeks or are slowly dwindling in numbers. Not to worry our birdwatchers and photographers though, as our resident Nuthatches and Woodpeckers are still hopping around the feeders and are more than happy to oblige a photo-op.

We are still catching lots of migrant songbirds such as Myrtle Warblers, Orange-crowned Warblers, Slate-coloured Juncos, and Hermit Thrushes. We also caught our first American Tree Sparrow of the fall!

Northern Saw-whet Owl migration is finally picking up and we are reliably catching at least one per night as well as the occasional Long-eared Owl in either the Saw-whet or Long-eared Owl targeted nets. We should be catching some good numbers by Steaks & Saw-whets (September 30<sup>th</sup> and October 1<sup>st</sup>), so make sure to get a ticket if you haven't yet!
