Weekly Update May 28th to June 3rd 2017

Another fun week has come and gone at the BBO. We caught 154 birds this week including two new species, Ovenbird and MacGillvray's warbler! We also had a very exciting recapture. The first of it's kind in BBO history! This week staff recaptured a female Ruby-Throated Hummingbird!!! Banded last year by Geoff Holroyd while out at the BBO during the Young Ornithologist workshop. That was a very exciting recap for everyone involved.

A lot of maintenance was done in the natural area to prepare for the Big Birding Breakfast. Meghan was hard at work painting new signs to put up and replace. As well, many hours were spent by staff and volunteers, to clear, clip and mow the trails and net lanes to make the natural area look as neat and tidy as possible.

The first day of the Big Birding Breakfast was a huge success. Over 30 people attended the breakfast and 30 birds were caught that morning, including the lovely Baltimore Orioles, Yellow Warblers and some interesting Trail's Flycatchers. The kids loved making their owl crafts and people enjoyed David Lawrie's insect collections of pinned butterflies, as well as the live moths he brought with him. Nature walks were led by David Lawrie and Geoff Holroyd, and the mosquitoes, for once, co-operated and were few in number.
