Weekly update August 25th to 31st

Fall migration monitoring is fully underway this week, with staff banding 69 birds of 26 species. Diversity of warblers was noteworthy this week, with 12 different species being banded. Highlights include Sharp-shinned hawk, Philadelphia Vireo and Canada Warbler. However, banding has been somewhat slow this week with rain in the later part of the week coming in during banding hours and hanging around all day!
