Weekly update September 8th to 14th

Fall migration continues this week with the rumblings of big days of mixed warbler flocks just starting! Weather this week started cool and cloudy, turning clear and sunny and ideal for songbird migration. Staff banded 150 birds of 20 species, with highlights being a Canada Warbler, Blue-headed Vireo, Palm Warbler and Swamp sparrow. We are also excited to see the beginning of some later migrations starting this week including Ruby-crowned Kinglet, White-throated Sparrow and Fox Sparrow!

This second week of owl banding has continued to be slow, as staff banded only 4 Saw-whet owls on their journey to their wintering grounds. However, Long-eared Owl banding was particularly exciting this week with 5 individuals banded!

BBO staff has made good use of the cool and wet weather, entering and reviewing data from the summer MAPS program and keeping our daily eBird observations up to date! We also continuously observe birds throughout the Beaverhill Natural Area and are impressed by the initial numbers of Snow Geese, Greater-white fronted Geese, Sandhill Cranes and Ducks moving through the area!
