November 1st - 7th, 2019

Fifteen owls were captured and banded during our final week at the BBO. Thriteen Saw-whet Owls (one was a foreign recapture, so not banded at the BBO! Exciting!), a Long-eared Owl and a Boreal Owl. We were happy to host the Augustana Wildlife Society as well as NAIT Bio Sci Club out for owls, along with our many visiting general public.

This week Sara, our head biologist, was the only remaining staff member on site as Christian and Jac have left the BBO to continue their winter adventures and we wish them both luck! To cover her days off, Christian, Josue, Geoff and Irene, kindly helped cover a couple of owl shifts to make sure our migration monitoring continued as long as possible! On November 7<sup>th</sup>, freezing rain was in the forecast, along with a heavy snowfall forecasted over the weekend, so the decision was made to shut down the lab for the season.
