Beaverhill Bird Observatory Update, April 30- May 7, 2018

Welcome to the 2018 season at the BBO! We have lots of friendly faces around the BBO this year, including myself (Emily Grose), Jeremy Lambe, Kevin Methuen, Sara Pearce Meijerink, and Michelle McKay. We are all excited for the summer of birding ahead.

Irene greeted us on the trail on April 30th, as we were heading into the lab to begin set-up and then she came back out the next day for our first day of banding. The first week of banding has been slow with approximately ten birds a day, but we have caught quite a few different species including many sparrows (White-throated, White-crowned, Lincoln's, and Song sparrows), in addition to Orange-crowned warblers, Myrtle warblers, Hermit thrushes, and Darkeyed juncos.

The feeders have been busy this past week with Purple Finches, Brownheaded Cowbirds, and a couple different woodpecker species (Yellow-bellied Sapsucker and Hairy Woodpecker). The Tree Swallows are also back at their nest boxes enjoying this weather. Further, the staff checked owl nest boxes this past week and unfortunately it does not look like any Saw-whet owls have nested in
