Beaverhill Bird Observatory Update, July 10- July 19, 2018

This past week at the banding lab we completed another round of MAPS with a total of 106 birds being caught. We have been catching entire families of Black-capped Chickadees which has been fun! There are only two rounds of MAPS left, the summer is just flying! Near the beginning of this past week we were able to band 4 Northern Saw-whet Owl chicks and 1 adult Northern Saw-whet Owl from one the nest boxes in the natural area. Geoff, Helen, Irene, and Brian came out to assist/watch the banding.

The BBO staff also took part in a mass recapture of Purple Martins at the Elis Bird Farm. The recapture was quite successful with recapturing 37 banded individuals! BBO staff along with Geoff went to a couple other Purple Martin landlord locations to re-trap more banded Purple Martins in the Beaverhill County. Further, this is Emily's last week working on the Purple Martin project with Glen Hyennagard in Camrose and there will be more about that project in the



next update. Lastly, BBO staff were also able to band some Mountain Bluebird chicks this week, as they nested in one of our Tree Swallow nest boxes within the natural area.

Another project underway at the BBO with Geoff and Laurie's help is putting up the new bat maternity roost boxes. This past week we installed the first one of 8 to go up in the natural area. Over the course of the next couple of weeks BBO staff will put up the rest of maternity roosts.

A big thank you this week to Geoff who came out to mow all our trails in the natural area again. He also kindly let the BBO staff use his generator and Helen let the
